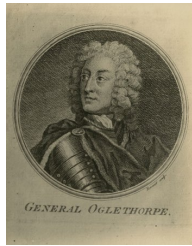


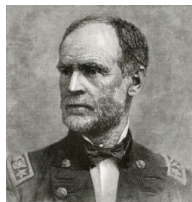

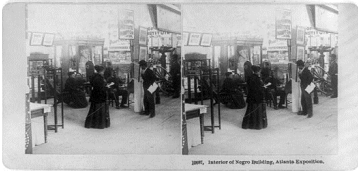

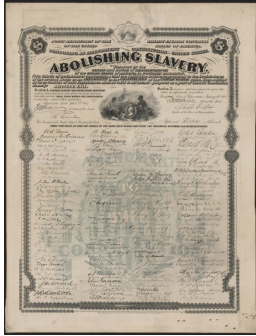

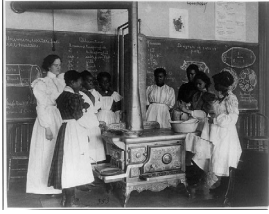

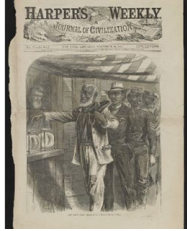
"Negro landowners, showing some newer, smaller shacks," 1939

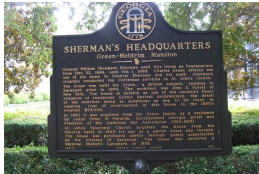

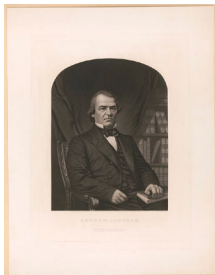

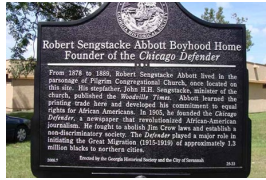
